The Simple Facts

• It's true: a female and male cat pair and their offspring can produce 420,000 cats in just seven years!

• Of those, 385,000 will be euthanized in shelters because there are no homes for them.

• Spay one cat and stop the birth of 100 homeless kittens!

• One unspayed female dog and her offspring can reproduce 67,000 offspring in six years!

• There are 45 cats and dogs for every person born in the U.S.

• A cat can get pregnant while nursing; a dog cannot.

- A cat can produce kittens every three months; a dog can produce pups twice a year.
- Only one out of 12 cats born ever finds a home.
- A pet can get cancer if not spayed/neutered.

• Eight-hundred dogs and cats are killed every HOUR in the U.S. because there are not enough homes for them all. •
